



SWINDON STREET'S QUIZ (1)

- 1 Previously referred to as Blacksmiths St and Windmill St, this thoroughfare is in Old Town.
- 2 This road was named after the famous Victorian writer, who was born in 1848.
- 3 The first Mayor of Swindon, who is buried at Christ Church, was the inspiration for this road.
- 4 A road with no houses was named after an Earl, who was a Liberal politician for Cirencester.
- 5 Besides being a well known builder and publican, George Whitehead also enjoyed his music. He named this road after a German composer.
- 6 The 50th anniversary of the incorporation of the Borough of Swindon had this built to commemorate it.
- 7 Quarry Terrace and Granville Terrace were built for the quarrymen of Old Town in this road, but it wasn't given this name until after a 3rd terrace was built in 1906.
- 8 In 1971, this small road off of High Street was named after Ambrose Lethbridge Goddard's wife, whom he married in 1847.
- 9 Church Place, by the GWR park, was previously known as what?
- 10 An Old Town jeweler bought part of the Rolleston estate and developed this road.
