- 1 When built, this street formed the Northern limit of building in Old Swindon.
- 2 Named after a former director of the GWR; he was a personal friend of I K Brunel. Does this fish swim in Rodbourne?
- 3 This Walcot road takes its' name from a farm on the Marlborough Downs, near Aldbourne, which passed to the Goddard family in the 16th century.
- 4 Does, or did, this road have a short hedge?
- 5 This Moreton road was opened in 1949, being named after the Mayor of the time, Francis -----.
- 6 When Swindon Borough Council was established in 1900, Bathampton Street was changed from what name?
- 7 The Superintendent of the Locomotive, Carriage and Wagon works in the GWR between 1864 and 1877 had this street in the Manchester Road area named after him.
- 8 When Rodbourne Cheney became part of the Borough of Swindon in 1928, 4 roads were amalgamated into just 1 road. What was this 'new' road called?
- 9 A large mansion, formerly owned by Levi Lapper Morse, gave its' name to this road, which had earlier been known as Wroughton Road.
- 10 Named after arguably Swindon Town's most famous pre WW1 footballer, who later ran a sports shop in the town.
